Making Tax Digital: what's changing for landlords?



From April 2026, you'll need to follow HMRC's rules for Making Tax Digital (MTD) for Income Tax, which will change the way you work with your accountant or bookkeeper.

What's changing?

MTD for Income Tax is a government initiative that will change the way that landlords manage their property finances and make tax submissions to HMRC.

From 6th April 2026, MTD for Income Tax will apply to all landlords whose total property and/or business income is above £50,000 per year.

If this is the case, you will need to use software to:

- Keep digital records of your income and expenses
- Send quarterly updates to HMRC
- Finalise your Income Tax position and submit a final declaration (which will replace the annual Self Assessment tax return) to HMRC
